Collaboration

The Collaboration Programme between Kent and Essex Police has gathered pace since both forces agreed in April 2007 to 'full collaboration on Operational Functions and Support Services, whilst maintaining operational independence'.

To date £8m of new savings has been identified through collaboration but efficiencies are only part of the picture. Collaboration is about delivering the highest possible quality service to the communities of Kent and Essex.

Two current projects involve the formation of a Serious Crime Directorate with more than 1,100 personnel and the joining together of both IT departments.

Kent and Essex are already sharing resources through a series of formal agreements in areas including Major Crime, Specialist Search, and Firearms Intervention. Other progress includes sharing the use of the Essex Police Helicopter; developing a Joint Marine Unit; and setting up a single unit to procure goods and services.

Single non-emergency number

01622 690690 is now the **single non-emergency** number for Kent Police across the county.

All local station numbers ending in 055 will be discontinued.

Adopting a single non-emergency number will make it easier for members of the public to contact Kent Police and to avoid confusion about which number non-emergency number to use. No other Kent Police telephone numbers or direct dial numbers to individual officers, teams, departments or members of staff will be affected by this change. Nor will neighbourhood policing team numbers change.

Use this number for non-urgent crime reporting, incidents of anti-social behaviour and general enquiries

Force Contact and Control Centre

This is the new name for our Force Communications Centre from **1 June 2010**. The new name encompasses the two core elements of work that the centre undertakes. Chief Superintendent Alan Horton: 'We are so much more than a communications centre – our call takers are the first point of contact for the public and our officers and staff are also in charge of the deployment of resources.'

The service that the **Force Contact and Control Centre** provides to both the public and Kent Police employees will remain the same.

New Chief Constable appointed

Kent Police Authority has appointed Ian Learmonth as the new Chief Constable of Kent Police.

Ian Learmonth, aged 52 from Ellingham, Norfolk, is Deputy Chief Constable for Norfolk Police. Ian has been a serving police officer since 1976 and has served at two other UK police forces before joining Norfolk Constabulary.

He began his career at Essex Police and spent 28 years in various roles including being posted to Stanstead Airport. After a 28-year career with Essex Police, Ian joined Strathclyde Police in May 2005.

In his role as Assistant Chief Constable he had responsibility for support services, roads policing, emergencies planning and most of the major projects on operational policing.

Ian was one of four candidates vying for the post. The other three candidates were:

- Giles York, Deputy Chief Constable for Sussex Police
- Simon Ash, Chief Constable of Suffolk Police
- Alfred Hitchcock, Deputy Chief Constable of the National College of Police Leadership and National Policing Improvement Agency (NPIA).

The shortlisted candidates faced an intense two-day interview process (19, 20 May) including a media interview and describing how they would deal with a topical police scenario. This was then followed by a formal interview with the panel scoring each candidate.

Talks will now begin with Norfolk Police Authority and it is hoped that Ian Learmonth will start in post in early July.
