152 a Representative's Report

The Assistant Clerk read Mrs Roscow's report in her absence:

Dennis and I strimmed and cut back brambles, ivy and other undergrowth on RS129, running behind Hollywood Lane.

We have also cut back undergrowth on RS125, the bridge between Wainscott and Upnor and trimmed back the hedge by the tennis courts. We have cut back undergrowth on RS120, between Cooling Rd and Cliffe Road.

We have strimmed and cleared some of RS131, between Brompton Farm Road and Dillywood Lane.

For the last two weeks we have been cutting back the undergrowth on RS122, from Castle Street Upnor. On Saturday 25th September we are going to be joined by some members of the Cuxton volunteers to help us with RS122. The aim is to cut it back a lot further in order for the plants to not converge upon the footpath so frequently. We met some of the Cuxton volunteers as well as some Medway volunteers last week.

Adam Taylor had arranged for us to have a trip and light lunch on board the Edith May as a thank you for our volunteering. It was a calm day with a mixture of cloud and sun. We made our way from Sun Pier to Gillingham marina after Adam had said a few words of thanks. After we passed Upnor Castle the engine was turned off and we continued slowly under sail. Frindsbury Extra Parish Council objects to this application. Loss of the garage will increase the pressure of on street parking on Choir Close and in the surrounding roads. This is already bad enough, causing difficulty for all road users, including pedestrians, cyclists, waste removal and emergency vehicles.

vi MC/21/2188 Plot 1, Unit 2 Anthonys Way, Medway City Estate: Advertisement consent for 1x internlly illuminated fascia sign and 1x non illuminated fascia sign to the front of the building on the North side

vii MC/21/2645 186 Frindsbury Hill, Wainscott: Construction of a single storey extension to the side; conversion of garage to living accommodation; pitched roof canopy to the front; dormer to the side and raised patio to the rear

Frindsbury Extra Parish Council objects to this application, for the same reasons it objected to a previous application on this site (MC/21/1980),t on the grounds of inadequate provision of off road parking, which might lead to parking on the A228, Frindsbury Hill, not far from the junction with the A289 at the nearby roundabout. Since this objection was made, the issue has been compounded by the granting of planning permission for a secondary school and change of use of the mediaeval barn to a wedding venue with provision of overnight accommodation and an administration block, also close to the roundabout.

viii MC/21/2710 H E Services (plant Hire) Ltd Whitewall Road Medway City Estate: Variation of condition 2 and 4 on planning permission MC/18/1185 - To allow a minor material amendment to condition 2 This submission provides the plans that are proposed to replace two of those already granted under MC/21/1990(WWR-LP-003-A and WWR-LP-004-A)
